From the standpoint of "really good" Suspense shows, the 1-hour episodes do not make the list, however, they remain an important part of the Suspense collection and its history.

Suspense was an early favorite and we have collected many versions since the mid 1970s. By the 1980s, we had published a complete Suspense collection catalog, then offered on cassette in the best sound at that time. In the early 2000s, however, we began again in the digital era.

One of the first ever **Suspense Logs** was available from **Jay Hickerson** in mimeograph format. Later, west coast collector **Randy Eidemiller** and **Chris Lembesis** published an excellent Suspense Log, all before the digital era. Lembesis included some fascinating articles including his description of what it was like to be in the audience during a Suspense broadcast and his correspondence with Agnes Moorehead. His publication, however, is long out of print and he passed away several years ago.

One of old-time radio's most esteemed authors and activists, **Martin Grams**, created perhaps the most impressive Suspense book as a high school project (also now out of print, but you may be able to snag one from eBay or Amazon).

Finally, assisted by Grams, **Darryl Shelton** has taken the Suspense Log book to another level in "**Tales Well Calculated to Keep You in Suspense.**" This book published by our friends at **Bear Manor Media**, is more readily available from the usual sources. What are "Mixed Bags" ?

There are hundreds of orphan shows floating around, and many other oddball shows never made it past the **DEMO** stage. Other shows were only found in limited quantities for various reasons. We prefer to get these shows out to the public as soon as possible in whatever form we can manage. We attempt to group similar shows together. Many of these shows are from disc and virtually all are of excellent sound quality.

What is "CD Text" ?

All audio CDs shipped out by us feature **CD Text** which displays pertinent information about the show while it is playing on your equipment. If you have older equipment, that feature is ignored.

Each and every show is processed using special proprietary methods developed over a 40 year period of professional experience. We strive to make recording levels and tonal balance consistent, and to minimize any flaws the original recording may have. When you order from us, however, you are not "buying" the program itself – only our services, and the cost of the media and/or server space where it is stored.

Most orders are shipped within 24 hours of receipt. Larger orders may take longer. Confirmation of shipping and tracking information (relayed from the U.S. Postal Service) is available via e-mail or a postcard for just \$1 extra.

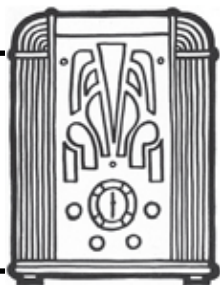
